

The Legacy League is a summer developmental baseball league that will operate in Jackson, Mississippi at Smith Wills Stadium ("SWS"), also the home of The Hank Aaron Sports Academy. SWS is a former Minor League Baseball Stadium that was home to the New York Mets (AA) and the Houston Astros (AA) MILB Teams and was so chosen as the home to HASA because of Hank's tireless pursuit of making the game available to all disadvantaged youth, regardless of race, gender or socio-economic conditions.

The purpose of The Legacy League is to provide Collegiate players a place to play during the summer months of June – July. These teams will play a 40 game schedule with teams comprised of players from all conferences, backgrounds and will include International players.

The goal is that each team will be diverse and will primarily include players from the SEC, SWAC, Sun Belt Conference and the American Athletic Conference. By working with these conferences, among others, we feel we have the best chance to accomplish our above -mentioned goals and objectives for equality in the sport of baseball, while also serving the greater south where athletes abound.

All Teams playing in one central location eliminates long road trips, hotel and bus costs as well as per diem and other incidentals. This has been welcomed by players who are coming from a collegiate season consisting of tens of thousands of travel miles and hundreds of hours on a bus every season. This also makes it easier for players to work, practice, play pick up games and "hang out" during the summer months while having a greater impact on the community with hundreds of players.

Each Team Owner has a background in professional sports and has established a reputation that is above reproach and recognizes the importance of being a part of the community as well as our desire to include and answer the call of Major League Baseball to make the sport more diverse.

The League will bear all expenses associated with owning and operating the teams, thus no upfront or future capital is required from selected owners. The League will collect all revenues from the 3 primary revenue streams (Ticket Sales, Concessions & Marketing) and other secondary sources such as live streaming and league owned LED / OOH Boards. Following each season, the owners will be presented with the annual profit / loss statement of League operations.

The League will retain a 49% share of ownership of each team and will cover all expenses associated with the League operations, using its share of revenues to operate the League and all expenses associated therewith. Each Owner will receive a minimum annual payout based on revenues following each season of play. Each Owner will receive the majority of his Team's merchandise sales.

Each Team will be operated as an LLC with <u>Butler Snow www.butlersnow.com</u> acting as League's legal representation and the League Commissioner acting as the Teams Managing Partner.

The League and all Teams will be represented by Banks-Finley-White CPA <u>www.bfwcpa.com</u> for all accounting matters and annual reporting.

Legacy League Owner – Tim Bennett, the league commissioner has a sister city agreement with Colombia, South America, which allows for International players participation in the Legacy League.

Player Entry Fee: \$750 to cover costs of (Umpires, Uniforms, Equipment, Game-day Operations) for a 40 game season.





Owner(s) will be required at least 1 annual in person visit and to attend annual League Meetings, 2 Virtual visits and will conduct media interviews (within reason) upon request during the season months of May – July.

FELLOWSHIP

The Legacy League has a Fellowship program that is supported by numerous University professors in the field of sport management. This component allows youth from local High Schools and Colleges the ability to work during the summer months in sport marketing fields such as but not limited to:

BROADCAST

Each game will be broadcast via live streaming. The stadium will be equipped with AI cameras that are remotely controlled while allowing a local play by play announcer to learn and or improve his / her skills calling "live" baseball games.

The Legacy League will be operated from the Hank Aaron Sports Academy and will provide the necessary office space and technology for all summer High School and Collegiate interns to work, learn and produce from.

Ken Griffey Swingman Classic (MLB All-Star Game)

An MLB selection committee identifies the top 50 HBCU baseball players. These players are divided into 2 Teams to participate in an exhibition game at the MLB All-Star game.

Hank Aaron Invitational (Jackie Robinson Complex)

Held the last two weeks of July at Jackie Robinson Training Complex in Vero Beach, Florida. Operated by MLB, the MLBPA and USA Baseball. Approximately 250 High School Juniors and Seniors from across the United States will receive elite-level training from former Major League players and coaches.

Truist Park (Truist Park)

The top 44 players from "Week 2" of the *Hank Aaron Invitational* will be invited in early August to play in a special showcase game at Truist Park, the home of the Atlanta Braves, as part of an extensive "Hank Aaron Week" hosted by the Braves and Major League Baseball. Hank Aaron Week will include a variety of diversity- and culture-focused initiatives focusing on business networking, nostalgic history connected to Aaron's legacy, philanthropy, education and social justice.

Legacy League (Hank Aaron Sports Academy)

- 1. Former professional athletes and MLB / MiLB executives will own each collegiate developmental team.
- 2. Teams will be comprised of youth from the Hank Aaron Invitational and the Ken Griffey Swing Man Classic.
- 3. These players (100) would play in the Legacy Leagues' 30 game schedule beginning the last Friday in May (Memorial Day Weekend) and concluding on July 4th (Independence Day) of each season.
- 4. Additional players to fill out the rosters will be selected from local, regional and national Colleges and Universities
- 5. All Legacy League Teams will play at one location, eliminating travel, saving player exhaustion.

Team Renteria (International)

The Renteria's specialize in scouting, developing and preparing International players for Major League Baseball and is based out of Barranquilla, Colombia. The Federation of Baseball that they represent consists of over 25 Countries and will be responsible for providing the Legacy League with qualified International players.

Player's participation will accomplish 2 primary objectives:

- Giving these players access to the same level of training during the summer as is offered by similar leagues such as the Cape Cod, Coastal Plains and Northwoods, helping them to further develop their skills on and off the field.
- Keeping the players active and playing together in advance of the Ken Griffey Swingman Classic and the Hank Aaron Invitational. This will allow each player to work together and sharpen each other's talent(s), while at the same time allowing the players to be in game day condition at the time(s) of their exhibition / exposure series.


